Academic Measures:

NWEA MAP—This assessment is taken by all scholars in grades K-8 as a nationally normed reference assessment to have an understanding of how scholars are performing as compared to their peers.

i-Ready—A computer assessment for scholars in grades K-8 in reading and math. Teachers use this data to plan daily instruction and is used daily by all scholars. The scholars test in reading and math and teachers analyze this data, create groups, and differentiate within their classrooms.

DIBELS—Scholars in grades K-2 participate to assess level of literacy skills for each scholar.

ORF (Oral Reading Fluency) - Scholars from grade 2-8 participate using a grade level text that is timed for one minute to see how many words per minute the scholar is able to read.

AIR State Assessment—Scholars in grade 3-8 are tested to assess mastery of Ohio's Learning Standards. The results are used to strengthen future instruction.

Curriculum:

Reading and Math followed Engage New York as our curriculum for all grades K-8. Science utilized Glencoe resources throughout the school year.

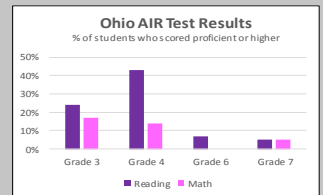

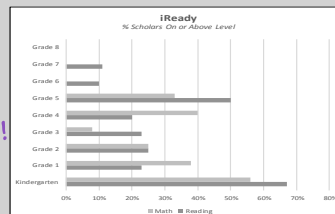

Highlights of 2017-2018

At Euclid Preparatory School we opened our doors for the first time in August of 2017 and we started the 2017-2018 school year with a focus on establishing a strong foundation of community, family and respect. We had many events that built our school and the community, which would be needed as we lost one of our own in November of 2017. The school and the community came together in support of the family with fundraising efforts and the support was far reaching from our colleagues in the media and in political office. The culture of family and strength continued into our celebration of Thanksgiving, with participation from our councilman, local news stations and over 300 guests, in a school of only 156 students. The school gave back to the community in other ways as well, including participating in the Coats for Kids drive to provide hats and gloves to families that needed them in the cold Northeast Ohio winter. Our parent volunteer organization assisted with enrollment efforts and school functions and shared the message of a true family environment at Euclid Preparatory with family and friends. We ended the year with 100% of the staff returning for the 2018-2019 school year. Our students and staff are excited for the improvements, and continued growth for the 2018-2019 school year. We will provide our students with opportunities to receive individualized instruction during intervention block daily. Students will engage in activities and lessons that address their individual needs. We will offer tutoring, and Saturday school for our students who need additional supports. This year we welcomed an instructional coach to our family that will support our teachers in delivering exceptional instruction. The teachers were supported in professional development sessions over the summer to strengthen our collective ability to analyze data to inform instruction. Our increased focus in these areas will drive the growth we are excited to see for the 2018-2019 school year at Euclid Preparatory School!

St. Aloysius, as the sponsor of this school, is legally mandated to provide oversight, monitoring, and technical assistance. As part of the monitoring process, the performance of the school on each of the required Ohio School Report Card components is assessed and evaluated. Additionally, St. Aloysius has a regular presence at school board meetings where student performance indicators such as attendance, behavior, and academic achievement are tracked and financial and organizational issues that impact student success are reviewed and discussed. Keys to oversight, monitoring, and support is St. Aloysius's review of the school's Ohio Improvement Process (OIP) plan development and implementation. As a result of our thorough oversight and monitoring, St. Aloysius has determined that this school is substantially compliant with the rules and regulations governing community schools.

All community school sponsors are required to submit a written report of the evaluation results of the school's academic, financial and organizational performance, as well as the school's legal compliance, to the Ohio Department of Education. This report must be made available to parents of students enrolled in the community school by November 30th of each year (OAC 3301-102-05 (A) (3)). An Annual Report regarding the performance of this school and other schools under the sponsorship of St. Aloysius will be posted on our website www.charterschoolsnet.com no later than November 30, 2018.
